



Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic

Multiple locations throughout Jefferson County, Wisconsin

Program Overview

The Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic provides discounted dental services to individuals in Jefferson County, Wisconsin with limited or no dental insurance. Fort HealthCare offers two unique financial aid options: a Self-Pay Discount, which is offered to individuals without health insurance or individuals receiving services not covered by specific programs, and a Community Care Program, which is reserved for individuals in need of medically necessary treatment who are unable to meet their financial responsibilities.

Program History and Development



The Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic opened in May 2007 in a vacant clinic within a Fort Atkinson HealthCare facility. The clinic was renovated to hold six treatment rooms with state-of-the-art dental equipment. Initially, it was operated by volunteer dentists, who provided 8 to 12 hours of services per week. In 2010, the clinic hired its first dentist and added a hygienist the following year. As of 2013, it had 11 paid staff, including two dentists, one

hygienist, six dental assistants, a patient coordinator, and a clinic director. The clinic's hours have also been extended and it is now open four days each week.

Wisconsin residents of the townships of Ixonia, Oconomowoc, Helenville, Sullivan, Cambridge, Fort Atkinson, Lake Mills, Johnson Creek, Watertown, Palmyra, Whitewater, Edgerton, Jefferson, and Waterloo are eligible for care.

Program Sustainability

- The Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic has received funding from: the Jefferson County Health Department, United Way of Jefferson County, United Way of Watertown, and Delta Dental.
- Initial funders include Wisconsin Medical College and Delta Dental.
- The program provides services free of charge to individuals unable to pay and individuals covered by Medicaid.
- The annual budget of the program is \$560,000.

Program Impact

- In 2015, the Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic provided 19,548 procedures to 5,882 individuals.
- The clinic receives 5-10 calls each day from new individuals and provides services to 35-40 individuals daily.
- Clients report that they are able to eat, sleep, and live without pain due to dental treatment received at Fort HealthCare Community Dental Clinic.
